HIV/AIDS Prevention at Hispanic Serving Institutions and Colleges

Through funding from the Office of Minority Health, Cardea partnered with two Hispanic Serving Colleges in South Texas between 2010 and 2014, to promote HIV/AIDS education and services, and has now produced a guidebook - Charting a New Course - based on the partnership's experiences.

Charting a New Course provides a road-map for developing and implementing a comprehensive HIV prevention program at minority college campuses. The guidebook presents Cardea's comprehensive planning model and highlights the implementation of HIV prevention programs at The University of Texas at Brownsville and Texas A&M University-Kingsville.

Some of the key resources you'll find in the guidebook include:

- How to set up a peer health education program
- Establishing on-campus counseling and testing programs
- Finding and working with community testing partners
- Producing a coordinated referral network
