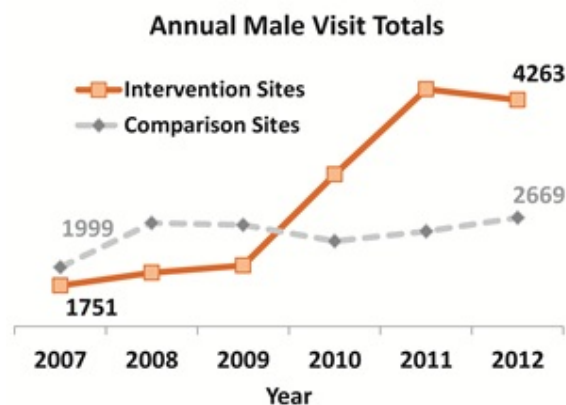

Getting Ready for Male Reproductive Health Services An Assessment and Implementation Toolkit

From 2008-2013, Cardea evaluated the effectiveness of a comprehensive service delivery model aimed at increasing the number of males who access family planning and related preventive health services in clinical settings, with support from the Office of Population Affairs.

In the participating clinics, male visits and STD screening tripled, with no negative impact on female visits.



Toolkit

Achieving gains in the number of men who access family planning and related preventive health services in clinical settings requires a comprehensive approach. To support that work, Cardea developed an Assessment and Implementation Toolkit, in collaboration with the participating clinics, to help:

1. Apply structured models of change to make the transition proceed smoothly
2. Train staff to promote male services with existing clients, and
3. Put plans in place to sustain the changes you've made.
